The season of Lent has been a tradition for reflection over the years. The church had set aside a time for repentance and servanthood with reflect on our dedication to God in the past year. But also, to take into consideration the cross coming at Good Friday. Lent has been one for self-control for many. The tradition of Fastnacht Tuesday is a Pa. German tradition that had my grandmother and many others cleaning out the cupboards to make doughnuts with lard. These doughnuts had little sugar in them so many of us used honey to coat them, so they went down with a sweet taste. This tradition was done the day before Ash Wednesday. Our church tradition had us limit our food consumption especially for the sweets like doughnuts yet other traditions in Christianity called for the restriction of eating meat on Fridays in Lent. Another tradition was to fast for certain days for spiritual signs or reflections on our living God's way. We read that Jesus was in the wilderness going without eating while being tempted in the wilderness with the Devil. (Mark 1:12, Matt. 4, Luke 4) Jesus went without eating to be clear of what evil was saying to him. This example of Jesus is why many feel fasting can help us discern what God is saying to them, but also if the devil is speaking to us. It seems that when we are satisfied with our food intake, we tend to forget our mission for God. I tend to call it "being spoiled." I have learned in a small group that met at 5 different restaurants over 15 years that grown men can complain about driving distances, the price of food, the quality of the waitress and, of course, the cost of the breakfast, all while the food we were eating was falling out of our mouths as God watched us. We all had transportation to these places. We all had the money to buy anything on the menu. We all had the time to sit and complain about how bad other people are as we complained to each other..... Spoiled Old Men.

Are you a spoiled person? That is what lent season is about. Looking into the proverbial mirror and reflecting on, am I grateful for what God has done for me? This is why many people fast in Lent. We do it to feel the pains of life that many in our world struggle with daily. Jesus taught us to pray for our daily bread. We have had enough bread for years, yet many in our world need to find food today because they had no access to food yesterday. In 2024 we still have many people who lack food daily. Yet many have used hunger strikes to protest the neglect of humanity to help humanity as Jesus has taught. Even Mahatma Gandhi used this method of communication to make a statement of Good for all mankind.

This Lent season we at EB will have an opportunity to talk about our faith. Our Lent study will be about forgiveness. We will view Adam Hamilton's DVD on forgiveness. Forgiveness is the key to our Christian faith. The more we learn to forgive, the more mature we grow in our faith of Jesus, our Lord. Adam teaches the way of Christ by pointing out that Jesus first forgave us, and we are to do the same. Forgiving others is what sets us free to live a life of hope, joy, peace and love each day of our lives. Come join our discussion. Look for the dates, times, and places in the newsletter and bulletins.

Hope to see you in the small group for conversion about our faith and, of course, Sunday worship will be a time of celebration and worship of God.



# Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the 40-day season of Lent.


"On Ash Wednesday, we mark our foreheads with a cross made of ashes from the burnt palm branches from last year's Palm Sunday service.

This mark is rich with significance. The cross is a sign of our faith that God can transform even the most terrible and final ending into a glorious new beginning. Indeed no power on earth can stop God's boundless love for us. Placing ashes on the head was a Biblical practice that demonstrated grief and repentance – the desire and intention to turn in a new direction.

With these ashes, we mourn the wounds of the world and acknowledge our commitment to Jesus' Way of radical love and reconciling justice. We recognize our mistakes and failures so we can be free to move in a new direction. Because they are the dusty remains of palm branches, these ashes also remind us of our mortality and our connection to the whole cycle of creation." - opentoGod.org
